


Regina YC Garcia is a poet, language artist, and English professor. She is a graduate of The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill where she earned a BA in Speech Communication with a Concentration in the Oral Interpretation of Literature. She additionally earned an MA in Adult Education from East Carolina University, as well as a Graduate Certificate in Multicultural and Transnational Literature. She currently teaches English at Pitt Community College.

Regina's literary work primarily centers around issues related to family and culture, social justice, and human rights. Garcia's first book of poetry, "The Firetalker's Daughter," was released by Finishing Line Press in Spring 2023.

Regina YC Garcia reflects on being an artist in Pitt County: "I am really fortunate to be a Pitt County Writer and Language Artist. Often, I think about what I can do to promote my art

in an area that does not always place emphasis on creating ample structural spaces for the community to experience the arts on an even larger scale with increased frequency. I think that's the nature of any artist, though, to reach for more, to build new worlds to exact their craft, to create connections between the self and the community.



However, I do recognize that "bigger" does not always dictate the effectiveness or impact that the arts have on the citizens of this community. For instance, Pitt County is ripe territory in which artistic production and performance possibly...surely... can allow for this rebirth and reconsideration of meaningful address to everyday life. In this are frequently born great opportunities for powerful artistic collaborations. For



example, my own art invites the audience to consider, to reflect, to act, to dream, to hope...well, I hope it does. This urgency is heightened through collaboration with other types of artists, as well as with entities that concern themselves with the importance of the arts. The joy is that we have artists and entities like this in our area who deem art important and necessary. Entities such as Emerge (seat of the Pitt County Arts Council), area colleges and schools, and other organizations have made making and experiencing the arts more possible for artists."

Regina concludes, "In Pitt County, the artist has the opportunity to give breath and hope and crucially, a more vibrant, aware, and inclusive community."

The Food from the **HeART Project was** an idea envisioned by Brandon Oualls of Ford + Shep, Deborah Sheppard of HeARToscope, and Holly Garriott and Paula Rountree of Emerge Gallery & Art Center. This project is a refrigerator that serves as public art and a perishable foods distribution site accessible to the South Greenville Elementary School community. Through the generosity of the ECU Health Foundation and local entrepreneurs, Nicole and Brandon Qualls, Food from the HeART has become a reality and will be evaluated for possible future replication.

The refrigerator project provides healthy foods for students and their families to access as needed.

The colorful artwork was designed by Paula Jordan-Mayo, Chair of the Black Creatives of Pitt County, whose work was chosen through a call for artwork.







Brandon Qualls shared upon the initial stocking of the refrigerator, "Nicole and I are humbled by the support for the Food from the HeART Project. We are grateful for the generosity and partnership with ECU Health. We are hopeful that this project will continue to grow into other local schools to help combat the rising rates of food insecurity in Pitt County."



Allison Covington, Principal of South Greenville Elementary School, said, "It is amazing what the power of community can do. We are grateful for our community members coming together to support the students and families of South Greenville. The Food from the HeART project will make a positive impact on our community as we continue to tackle food insecurity. We are incredibly grateful!"

Winterville Historical and Arts Society utilized Rescue and Rebuild Grant funding administered by Pitt County Arts Council at Emerge to bring in local musicians, their bands, and ensembles, to provide some fun nights and afternoons of high-quality entertainment for people in our area.

The historic Winterville Depot proved to be a perfect concert venue for the Winterville Historical and Arts Society to host the seven concerts.

The series opened with a very enjoyable evening with the Steve Creech Quartet (first photo). Performances continued with Michael Stephenson and Friends (second photo), The Spiritualities and NuMynistree (third photo), Shannon Baker & Sometime Soon, Lightnin' Wells, and The Tar River Boys (fourth photo).

You ask, "So how did they accomplish all this as a team?"

Winterville Historical and Arts Society's Spring Concert Series, which began on April 11, and ended on May 23, was possible because their board devised a workable plan and then board members worked in harmony to make the concerts a success.





All board members were involved in one way or another whenever they were available, working as a team and pitching in to make it all work smoothly.

Behind the scenes, board member Jesse Riggs resurrected his skills acquired from assisting with stage lighting during his college days. With the assistance of board member Abbott Hunsucker, they rigged up overhead lighting to create a nice effect for the section of the room that was chosen to be the "stage area."

As she had promised, Trish Worthington Cobb, who had devised and presented the scheme for this seven-concert series to the board, showed up before each concert to open the depot in time to greet each band and allow them to set up.

Each concert was well attended, with people enjoying a night out with good music in an intimate, unique, and historic venue. Many positive comments were expressed by attendees.

The Greenville Theatre Arts Center (GTAC) employed Rescue and Rebuild Grant funding administered by Pitt County Arts Council at Emerge to reestablish their staff, programs, and outreach capabilities. Terri Campbell-Payton, Program Director, has flourished in collaborating with fellow arts organizations and creating the peaceful, artistic environment desired by her own organization.

This spring, Terri performed with the ECU School of Theatre and Dance in their production of Last Stop on Market Street. The musical was presented to the entire community as part of ECU's Arts Smart program. Arts Smart is intended for school groups and is steeply discounted to support K-5 learners across a 13-county area.

Last Stop on Market Street is a children's book written in 2015 by Matt de la Peña and illustrated by Christian Robinson. Playwright Cheryl Wright premiered the book as a live musical in 2018 bringing the storybook to life with lyricists and composers Paris Ray Dozier and Lamont Dozier





This colorful show was performed at ECU's Wright Auditorium by ECU Storybook Theater as well as at The Roxy, presented by the Greenville Theatre Arts Center. Both performances starred ECU students Isaiah Bussey as the character "C.J." and Terri Campbell-Payton as the character "Nana Teacake".

The momentum of the performances led to a wonderful start of GTAC's Summer Camp program, which served 25 students between the ages of 7-17. The camp focused on encouraging, empowering, and motivating youth to work on building their selfesteem, self-discipline, and self-trust through the five elements of fine arts. The program is based off of teaching movement with emotions and feelings through musical genres including but not limited to, jazz, hip-hop, afrobeats, and musical theatre. The Summer Production, "I am Somebody" concluded 8-week artistic healing program.

To continue the powerful outreach that GTAC has established, they are hosting "Live at the Roxy" each month. This open mic style event will highlight Greenville's colorful, creative community.

Since 2003, thousands of children have enjoyed immersive summer art camp experiences at Emerge Gallery & Art Center. The art camps have introduced a generation of Pitt County youth to handbuilding and wheel work in the pottery studio; photography and digital illustration in our darkroom/computer lab; jewelry work in our metals studio; plus painting, drawing, animating and even bookmaking.

Our summer art camps relate directly to our mission — to educate through the arts. Indeed, we aspire to inspire and create lifelong visual art learners, makers, and appreciators.

Another part of our mission is to make the arts accessible to the entire community. We take access seriously and have offered summer art camp scholarships for many years. The parents or guardians of campers apply for support and campers are hosted according to their interests, pending the availability of funds.

To ensure a scholarship pool large enough to accommodate anticipated applications, Emerge Gallery & Art Center will host a summer art camp scholarship drive this fall—launching on Giving Tuesday (November 28) and running through the end of the calendar year.

Gifts at any and every amount earmarked for the fund will be pooled, then allocated to youth in need who are currently living in Pitt County. If you would care to make a gift at this time, use the QR code on this page to give online, or send a check using the address in the back of the ArtZine with "scholarship fund" in the memo.

A full week of art camp costs \$240 per child. We've set a goal of \$10,000 for this campaign so that we can host four scholarship campers per week for all ten weeks of summer camp. We run three to five sessions each week to accommodate different age groups and interests, pre-kindergarten through high school.

A parent of a Mini Master who received a camp scholarship shared with us the following. "Zamiya really enjoyed her time with Emerge Arts. She always came home telling about the great things they did. This was the perfect camp for her because she loves art and it really fostered her abilities even at the age of 5. She was taught new things but was also able to draw freely. I would definitely sign her up again."

The Youth Arts Festival began in 2005, on the campus mall of East Carolina University. In 2019, partnering with the City of Greenville and Emerge Gallery, the festival expanded and moved to Greenville Town Common to become more of an inclusive community festival.

The festival offers free demonstrations and handson art activities for youth of all ages. Everything from the potter's wheel to puppet making, playing instruments to blacksmithing, there is something new and exciting to learn and create. Artists of all types come from our region to volunteer and share their talents with our community.

The festival typically draws over 4,000 people, and the project leaders look forward to another great year with growing numbers of community partners and attendees. Proceeds from sponsorships and donations benefit the Pitt County Schools Arts Educators Fund. The fund will be distributed to Arts Educators to purchase supplies for their classrooms.







The Youth Arts Festival is a joint project with Emerge Gallery & Art Center, Greenville Recreation & Parks Department, East Carolina University's College of Fine Arts and Communication, and the Arts Education programs of Pitt County Schools.

This year's festival will feature visual, musical, and theatrical arts booths where children can participate in creative activities making their own masterpieces. There will also be performance-based activities including puppet making, storytelling, music, and interactive theater. Performances by groups from Pitt County Schools, East Carolina University, and community arts organizations will occur throughout the day at the amphitheater.

The event is scheduled for Saturday, October 14, 2023 from 10:00am – 4:00pm on Greenville Town Common, so mark it on your calendar now. The festival is free and open to the public. Parking is free.

Member Highlight

After nearly a quarter of a century in Greenville, Devinder and Steve Culver are still honing their North Carolina accents. On their arrival, Steve took up the position of Chair of the Department of Geological Sciences at East Carolina University, a position he held until 2022. He still teaches paleontology and the history of the Earth and conducts research on the effects of climate change on the North Carolina coast. Devinder immersed herself in the local community and works for the Greenville Police Department as the Community Projects Coordinator. Devinder's collaboration with Jane Austen Behan, the first board member of Emerge Gallery, and Dr. Cynthia Bickley-Green, Professor of Art Education at ECU, began in 2006 with the Youth Art Expressions Project. The group worked with Pitt County Schools' art teachers and students on different topics which reflected happenings in the community. The artworks created by the students were exhibited at East Carolina University, Greenville Mall, and in local schools, thus making the arts accessible to all. According to Devinder, "The importance of art in all its forms cannot be stressed enough. Art is not only a reflection of our past and current values and culture, but it also has the power to change opinions and bridge those gaps which may at times divide us."
